



# Final Quarterly Report and Disclosure for the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF II) Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA)

CHAMBERLAIN UNIVERSITY

On December 27th, 2020 the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) was enacted, allocating additional funds to Institutions of Higher Education to use towards financial aid grants to students. Section 314 (e) of CRRSAA requires institutions to submit a report to the Secretary describing the use of funds distributed from HEERF. This report provides the required details on how Chamberlain University used funds awarded under CRRSAA (a)(4) from January 1, 2021 to March 31, 2021. All funds were awarded and expended in this quarter. As a result, this report is marked as final.

1. On January 26th, 2021, Chamberlain University signed and returned the Certification and Agreement form to the Department of Education. Funds received under CRRSAA(a)(4) have been used to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.
2. On February 17th, 2021, Chamberlain University received \$7,147,074 in funds under CRRSAA(a)(4).
3. \$7,147,074 has been distributed to students in the form of emergency financial aid grants under CRRSAA (a)(4) as of March 31, 2021.
4. The estimated total number of students that were eligible to receive emergency financial aid grants under the CRRSAA(a)(4) is 6,960.
5. 6,960 students received an emergency financial aid grant under CRRSAA(a)(4).
6. Under CRRSAA institutions were required to prioritize students with exceptional need. Chamberlain students enrolled in the January 2021 session as of February 17th, 2021 in a degree or certificate program with an expected family contribution of zero<sup>1</sup> received an emergency financial aid grant. The amount awarded was determined by dividing the total award, \$7,147,074, by the total number of eligible students, 6,960. Each student received \$1026.92<sup>2</sup>.
7. The award notification to students directed them to use the emergency financial aid grant for any costs incurred on or after Sunday, December 27, 2020 related to emergency costs which arose due to Covid-19, such as food, housing, health care or child care or for any component of the student's cost of attendance.
